This Bulletin will serve as the guiding document for the format of the BC Winter Games (BCWG) 2020. #### U14 Females: 17 skaters

Event	Seeding	Advancement
400m (short track)	400m personal best seed time skated in a sanctioned competition on the 100m track. Those without an applicable seed time will be seeded last.	<ul> <li>Heat 2+0</li> <li>Semi-final 2+0 top, 2+0 bottom</li> <li>Final A-D</li> </ul>
1500m (short track)	1500m personal best seed time skated in a sanctioned competition on the 100m track. Those without an applicable seed time will be seeded last.	<ul><li>Heat 2+0</li><li>Final A-C</li></ul>
2000m Points Race (short track)	Cumulative ranking from the first two distances.	Super final. Each race will be limited to 8 skaters. In the event of a tie for the 8th or 16th position, the skater with the better 1500m ranking will be admitted to the higher final. Please see the SSC Competitions Format Bulletin for more details regarding the 2000m points race.
3000m Relay (short track)	Zones that are able to field a complete team (3 or 4 skaters) will be eligible to compete for medals. Zones may enter a second team if they are able to; no skater may be a member of more than one team. Teams will be seeded into heats based on the average 400m seed times of all the skaters on the team. Exhibition relays may be run as time permits for skaters not on a Zone team.	<ul><li>Heat 0+4</li><li>Final A-B</li></ul>
500m Olympic Style (long track)	Sanctioned time trials will be run on Saturday. Skaters will be paired based on their 500m Olympic Style long track personal best time skated in a sanctioned competition. Those without an applicable seed time will be seeded last, based on the 400m personal best seed time used to seed them into the 400m event at the BCWG 2020. Pairs will skate from slowest to fastest.	Skaters will be paired for the medal round of racing based on the results of the sanctioned time trials. For the purpose of ranking, reskates will be allowed during the time trials under certain circumstances (e.g. falls) at the referee's discretion. Pairs will skate from slowest to fastest. Medals will be awarded based exclusively on the results of the medal round of racing.
7-lap Mass Start (long track)	All skaters will compete in Final A, with a maximum of 6 skaters in each row. Start positions will be based on the results from the 500m Olympic Style event. The event will feature a neutral lap at the beginning.	n/a

1500m (short track)	1500m personal best seed time skated in a sanctioned competition on the 100m track. Those without an applicable seed time will be seeded last.	<ul><li>Heat 1+1</li><li>Final A-E</li></ul>
2000m Points Race (short track)	Cumulative ranking from the first two distances.	Super final. Each race will be limited to 8 skaters. In the event of a tie for the 8th, 16th or 24th position, the skater with the better 1500m ranking will be admitted to the higher final. Please see the SSC Competitions Format Bulletin for more details regarding the 2000m points race.
3000m Relay (short track)	Zones that are able to field a complete team (3 or 4 skaters) will be eligible to compete for medals. Zones may enter a second team if they are able to; no skater may be a member of more than one team. Teams will be seeded into heats based on the average 400m seed times of all the skaters on the team. Exhibition relays may be run as time permits for skaters not on a Zone team.	<ul><li>Heat 2+0</li><li>Final A-B</li></ul>
500m Olympic Style (long track)	Sanctioned time trials will be run on Saturday. Skaters will be paired based on their 500m Olympic Style long track personal best time skated in a sanctioned competition. Those without an applicable seed time will be seeded last, based on the 400m personal best seed time used to seed them into the 400m event at the BCWG 2020. Pairs will skate from slowest to fastest.	Skaters will be paired for the medal round of racing based on the results of the sanctioned time trials. For the purpose of ranking, reskates will be allowed during the time trials under certain circumstances (e.g. falls) at the referee's discretion. Pairs will skate from slowest to fastest. Medals will be awarded based exclusively on the results of the medal round of racing.
7-lap Mass Start (long track)	18 skaters, based on cumulative ranking, will compete in Final A, with a maximum of 6 skaters in each row. The remaining skaters will compete in Final B. Start positions will be based on the results from the 500m Olympic Style event. The event will feature a neutral lap at the beginning.	n/a
